Patient Instructions for Collecting Fecal Occult Blood/FOBT

Preparing for collection

Certain foods, vitamins and drugs may alter the results of your occult blood sample. Therefore, before collecting the specimen you should discontinue taking the following:

- Steroids and non-steroidal anti-inflammatory drugs such as ibuprofen, naproxen, or aspirin should be avoided 7 days before and during testing. They may irritate mucosa and cause bleeding. Acetaminophen (Tylenol ®) can be taken as needed.
- Avoid red meat (beef, lamb, liver) for 3 days before and during stool collection period.
- Vitamin C in excess of 250 mg per day from supplements for 3 days before and during test.
- **Raw fruits and vegetables** especially melons, radishes, turnips, and horseradish should be avoided. They can produce false-positives.

Collection Instructions

Do not collect sample if blood is visible in your stool or urine (e.g. menstruation, active hemorrhoids, urinary tract infection). Contact your doctor.

- 1. Pass urine into toilet.
- 2. Place toilet "hat" onto the rim of the toilet and pass stool into the "hat".
- 3. Lift flap on the occult card.
- 4. Using an applicator (Popsicle stick) provided collect a small fecal sample.
- 5. Apply a thin smear covering Box A.
- 6. Reuse applicator to obtain a second sample from a different part of the stool.
- 7. Apply a thin smear covering Box B.
- 8. Close cover flap, being careful to not pull silver tab on back of card.
- 9. Dispose of applicator and "hat".
- 10. Label occult card with sticker provided, with name, date of birth, date, and time of collection.
- 11. Return completed test card(s) to the Laboratory no later than 5 days after your first sample collection.
